War Trophies or Curios? The 'War Museum Collection' of Museum Victoria 'War Museum Collection' to be published in September and written by *Dr Barry Craig, Dr Christine Winter* and *Dr Ron Vanderwal,* describes a collection of original ethnographic objects from the Sepik River region, Morobe, the Bismarck Archipelago and Bougainville. It was assembled by officers and men of the AN&MEF 1914 - 1921 for the then proposed Australian War Museum. Deemed not 'actual war trophies' this collection now resides at Museum Victoria.

Dr Christine Winter, Visiting Research Fellow, ANU, Senior Research Fellow University of Sydney will provide an historical overview of the German and AN&MEF administrations and of some of the people who collected these 'native curios'. Dr Barry Craig, Curator of Foreign Ethnology, South Australian Museum will present a sample of the objects collected.

**World War Two - The Pacific War: A Lived Experience** *Phillip Bradley, Australian military historian and author*Described as 'one of the finest chroniclers of the Australian Army's role in the New Guinea campaign' Phillip brings the war to life with the intimate knowledge he gained from many trips to the battlefields.
